SUCCESSES

10% of respondents were new to grants

55% of state, local, & NGO respondents say performance improved in 2018

65% felt positive and grants directives are well received especially the Uniform Grant Guidance (UGG)

CHALLENGES

43% of federal respondents can't measure performance

62% feel grant funding is uncertain & susceptible to politics

DATA

The federal government issues over **\$700 billion** in grants every year.

89% of financial data collected is the most timely, useful, & reliable for performance

52% Self-reported quarterly data is the most common data collection mechanism
